- Got admission in college in science group
- After a few days went to principal with an application for change of subjects from science to arts
- The principal rejected the application
- Next year took admission in arts group
- Became Gold Medalist in M. A. (Punjabi)
- Has become a globally known eminent poet
- Has been honored with prestigious awards like Sahitya Academy Award, Saraswati Award, Padmasri Award

• DR. ISHAN PUROHIT – ANOTHER EXAMPLE OF MENTER

- Went on a trekking trip to hills of UTTARAKHAND
- Met a local boy who volunteered to accompany him as a guide
- Learnt during the trip that the boy, despite having a B. Sc. degree, is running a small tea shop
- The boy was undergoing tough time due to several problems in the family....death of mother, paralytic attack to father, blindness and tumor problems of sister...financial condition miserable
- Brought the boy (NARESH) to NEW DELHI and helped him to get coaching for admission to higher studies
- > NARESH got M. Sc. (Biotechnology) Degree from IIT Roorkee
- Has been awarded prestigious Marie Curie Fellowship to undertake Ph. D. program at EMBL, ZURICH, SWITZERLAND

- Transformed synthetic biology
- Time 100 most influential people in the world (2007)
- Founder : Celera genomics, Institute for Genomic Research , J. Craig Venter Institute

24. MARIO RENATO CAPECCHI (Oct 6, 1937-)

Difficulties/Struggle

- Had to live without family support from age 4 to 10
- Faced extremely harsh childhood
- Suffered from malnutrition and serious illness

25. JAMES B. SUMNER (1887 -1955)

Difficulties/Struggle

Achievements

- Developed site -directed mutagenesis method in mouse
- Nobel prize in Physiology or Medicine 2007

- Average student in school
- Basically left handed
- Lost his left forearm at age 17

26. SIDNEY BRENNER (January 13, 1927)

Difficulties/Struggle

- Belonged to a poor family
- His father was not in a position to send him to school
- A lady supported and gave admission for free in her school to educate him

27. BALWAN SINGH

Difficulties/Struggle

- Average academic career
- Completed M.Sc. in 4 years
- Worked as technician

- Isolated first enzyme
- Nobel Prize in Chemistry 1946

Achievements

- Became one of the founders of molecular biology
- Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine 2002

- Offered faculty position by Emory University, U.S.A.
- Eminent scientist in the field of immunology

28. **MANPREET SINGH**

Difficulties/Struggle

- □ In the University of Roorkee entrance exam, he wanted to leave the examination hall after 5 minutes thinking that he did not know anything
- The invigilator did not allow him to leave the examination hall because of the rules

Achievements

- Qualified University of Roorkee Entrance Exam
- Became Gold Medalist of his Batch, B. E. (Mechanical Engineering)
- □ His B. E. project was declared the best project of the University
- Presently C. E. O. of BSS Software Pvt. Ltd. Mumbai and Singapore

29. **DALIP SINGH UPPAL**

Difficulties/Struggle

- Passed matriculation in first division
- Due to family's financial situation, had to take job as BELDAR
- During the job his duty

- Joined as a typist in Civil Secretariat of State Govt
- Learnt shorthand and became a Steno
- Through correspondence got B.A., M. A. Degrees

was to take care of buffaloes

- One day his supervisor noticed that he gave an excellent bath to a buffalo
- The supervisor after knowing he is matriculate with first division shifted him to office for learning typing work
- Joined as Deputy Registrar in Punjabi University Patiala
- Retired as Finance Officer from Punjabi University Patiala

30. **TEG SINGH**

Difficulties/Struggle

- Had to discontinue studies after 12th standard due to death of his father
- Took job as a peon in a university
 Had to take care of mother and three unmarried sisters

Achievements

- Along with his job he got the following degrees through correspondence:
 B. A., M. A., M. Phil
- Qualified National Level NET Test for lectureship
- Presently enrolled as Ph.D. student

31. BANARSI LAL CHAWLA

Difficulties/Struggle

- Education upto 5th standard
- Had to work for livelihood at the age of 11 ; Sold biscuits at railway platform ; Sold peanuts by roadside

32. MADAN VASISHTA

Difficulties/Struggle

- Became permanently deaf at the age of 12
- Had to leave school in class 6th
- Took care of cattle at house for 10 years

- First in Asia to set up an automobile tyre factory
- His daughter was the first Indian girl to go in space

Achievements

- First Indian to get Ph.D. from Gallaudet University, U.S.A.
- Became a faculty member at Gallaudet University
- Gallaudet University published his autobiography

33. FAUJA SINGH Career rediscovered at 81

Difficulties/Struggle

Felt devastated at age 81 due to death of wife,

Achievements

• First in the world to complete full marathon at

daughter and son

Started running to pass time at the age 81

34. NATALIA PARTYKA

Difficulties/Struggle

- Born on July 27, 1989 without right hand and forearm
- Started playing table tennis at the age of seven

the age 100 (2011)

- Set 8 world age group records at age 100 (2011)
- Marathons run : London (5), Toronto (2), New York (1)

Achievements

- Became an international table tennis player
- Reached the last 32 of the London 2012 Olympic women's table tennis
- In 2004, won a gold medal in the singles event of Athens Paralympics and in 2008, won a gold medal in the singles event of Beijing Paralympics

35. **JESSICA COX**

Difficulties/Struggle

• Born without arms

- first pilot ever to fly a plane using only her feet
- Has become a

motivational speaker
